The purpose of Dominion Schools is to regard each student as a treasure created by a loving heavenly Father and to assist the student in reaching his/her greatest potential through Christ-centered academic, moral and spiritual instruction. Dominion offers a challenging and diverse college preparatory curriculum in a Christian private school setting that is aligned with state and national standards. At Dominion, academic excellence consists of thorough instruction in the basic disciplines, the development of sound study habits, and the opportunity to be challenged by increasingly complex subject matter -- all integrated with a Biblical worldview.

COMMUNITY, FACULTY & STUDENTS

Established in 1997, Dominion Christian Schools is an accredited private, co-educational, independent Christian day school for grades 6-12.

ACCREDITATION

Dominion Christian Schools is accredited by the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS). All faculty members are certified.



CURRICULUM

Dominion has 8 class periods each day. Classes meet for 46 minutes four days a week, and for 39 minutes one day a week. There are two semesters in the school year. Credit is granted each semester independently of any other semester.

The curriculum taught at Dominion is a complete college-preparatory curriculum. In addition, Honors, Advanced Placement (AP), and Dual Enrollment (DE) courses are offered as indicated under the course listing.

Dual Enrollment courses are offered through a partnership with Truett McConnell College (TMU). All DE courses are offered on the DCS campus. Students taking DE courses will receive high school and college credit while meeting graduation requirements for a DCS diploma. There is no fee for the DE program. DCS' Dual Enrollment is a selective enrollment program; academic requirements from both TMU and DCS must be met in order to enroll.

DCS has implemented a partial immersion model of STEM. DCS middle school has formal STEM electives varying topics from year to year. DCS also integrates STEM-related experiences into the science curriculum throughout middle and high school.

Understanding that every student is uniquely and wonderfully made, DCS makes every attempt to provide an individualized program for each student. In the event a course is not offered, students may request to take online courses (Ex: AP Courses, other Foreign Languages) for credit towards a diploma.

The DCS Academic Coaching Program is a program that provides for support for students with learning disabilities. During the course the student learns how to use an agenda; improves study skills; utilizes test accommodations; learns the art of organization; recognizes their learning style and learn ways to best utilize them; and sets goals and achieves them.

Calculated each semester, the cumulative weighted GPA is listed on the student's transcript. All academic classes are included in GPA and used for class ranking. Only students who have been enrolled at in Dominion's high school for their junior and senior year are eligible for graduation ranking.
